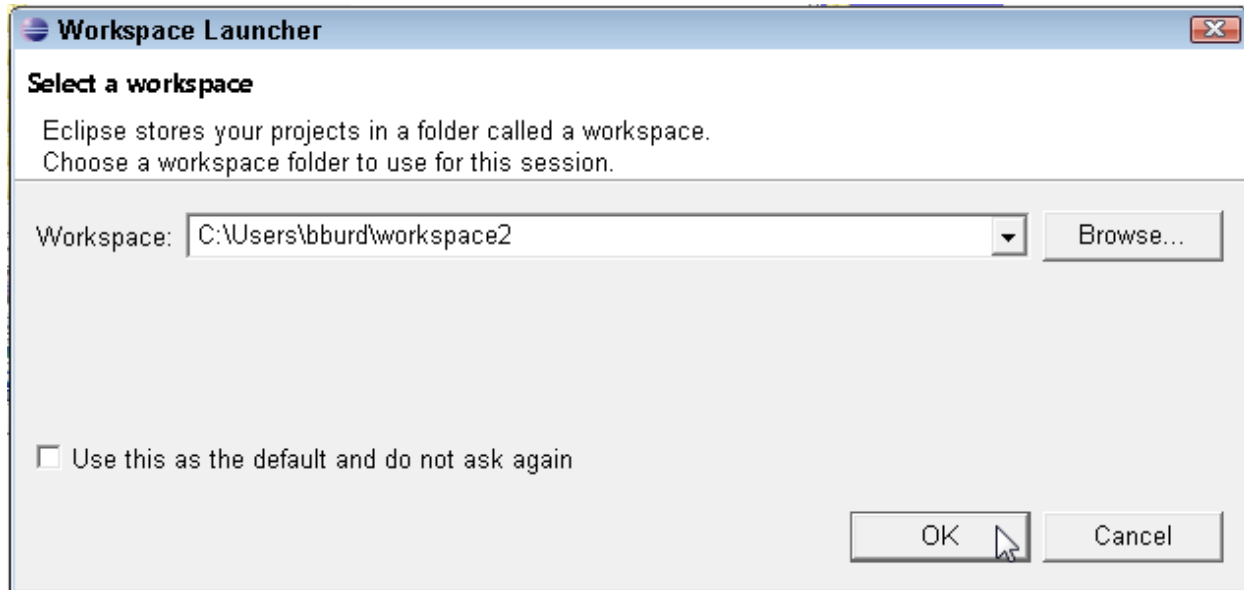


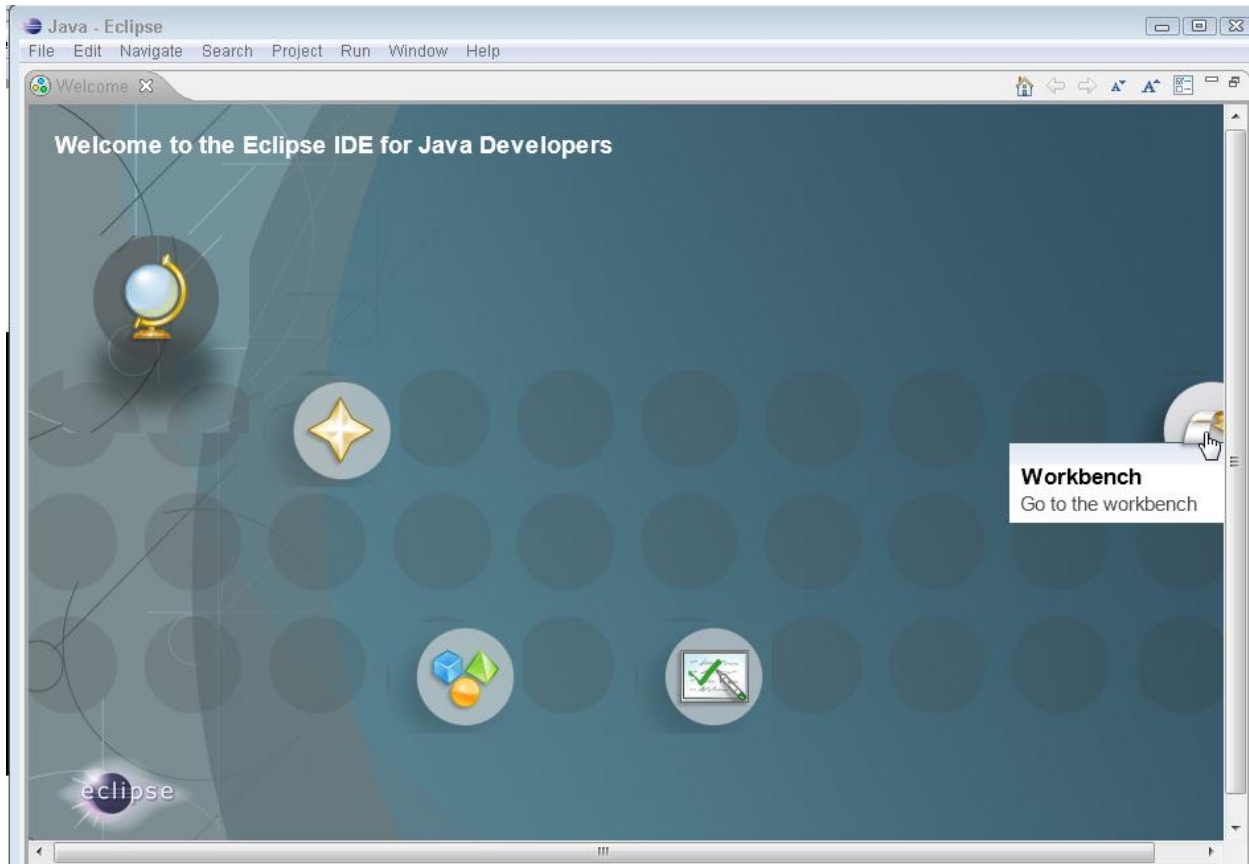

## ***Using Eclipse...***

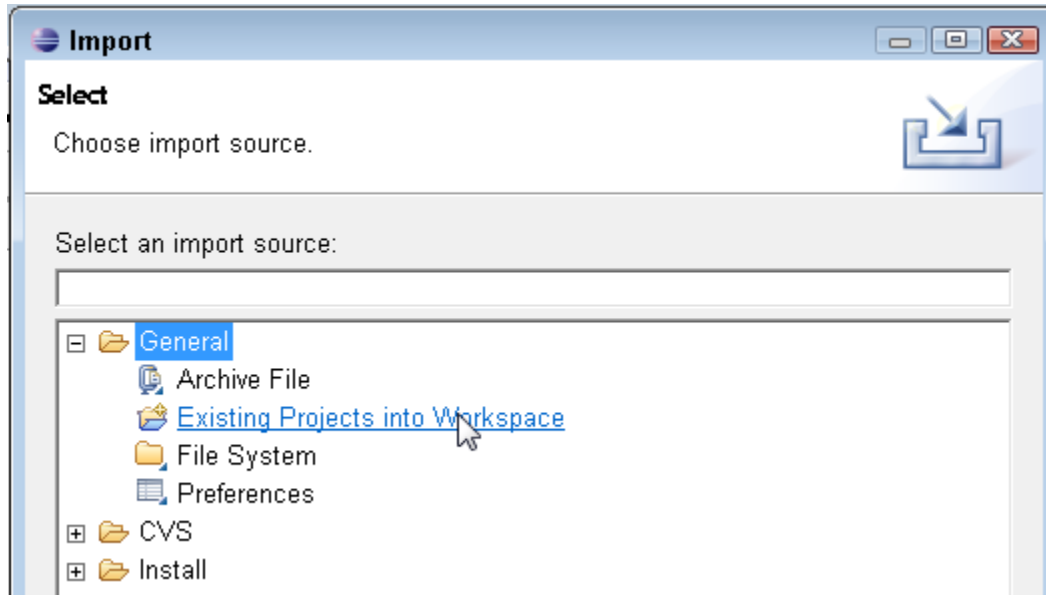
***Select a workspace. (The workspace name that Eclipse suggests is fine.)***



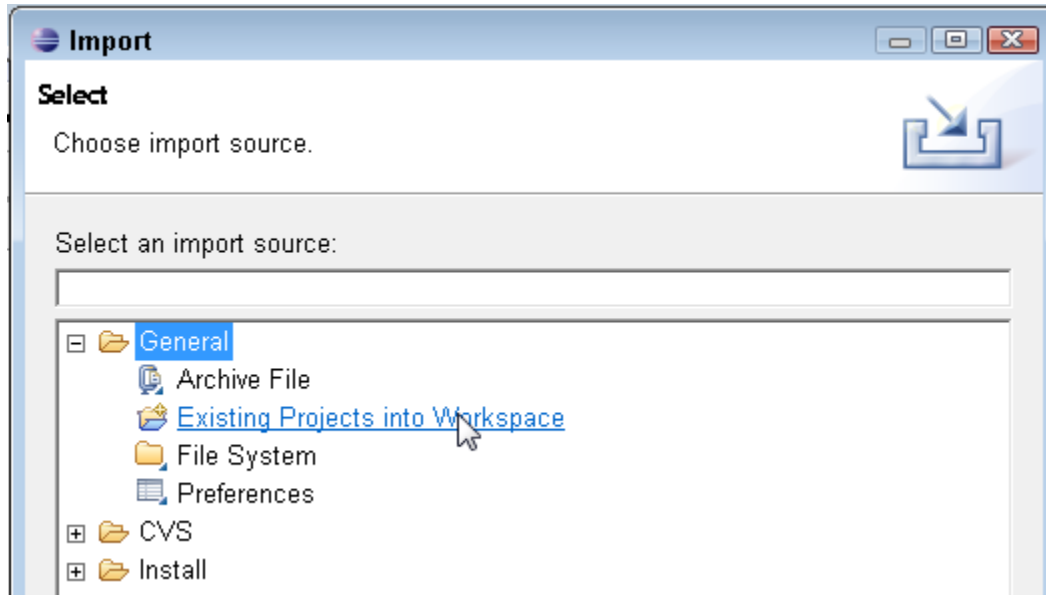
***In the Welcome screen, click the Workbench icon.***



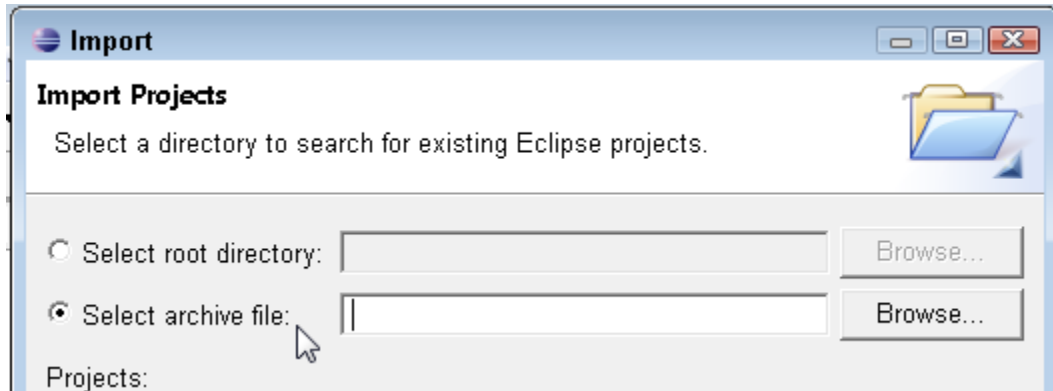
# *Import Existing Projects.*



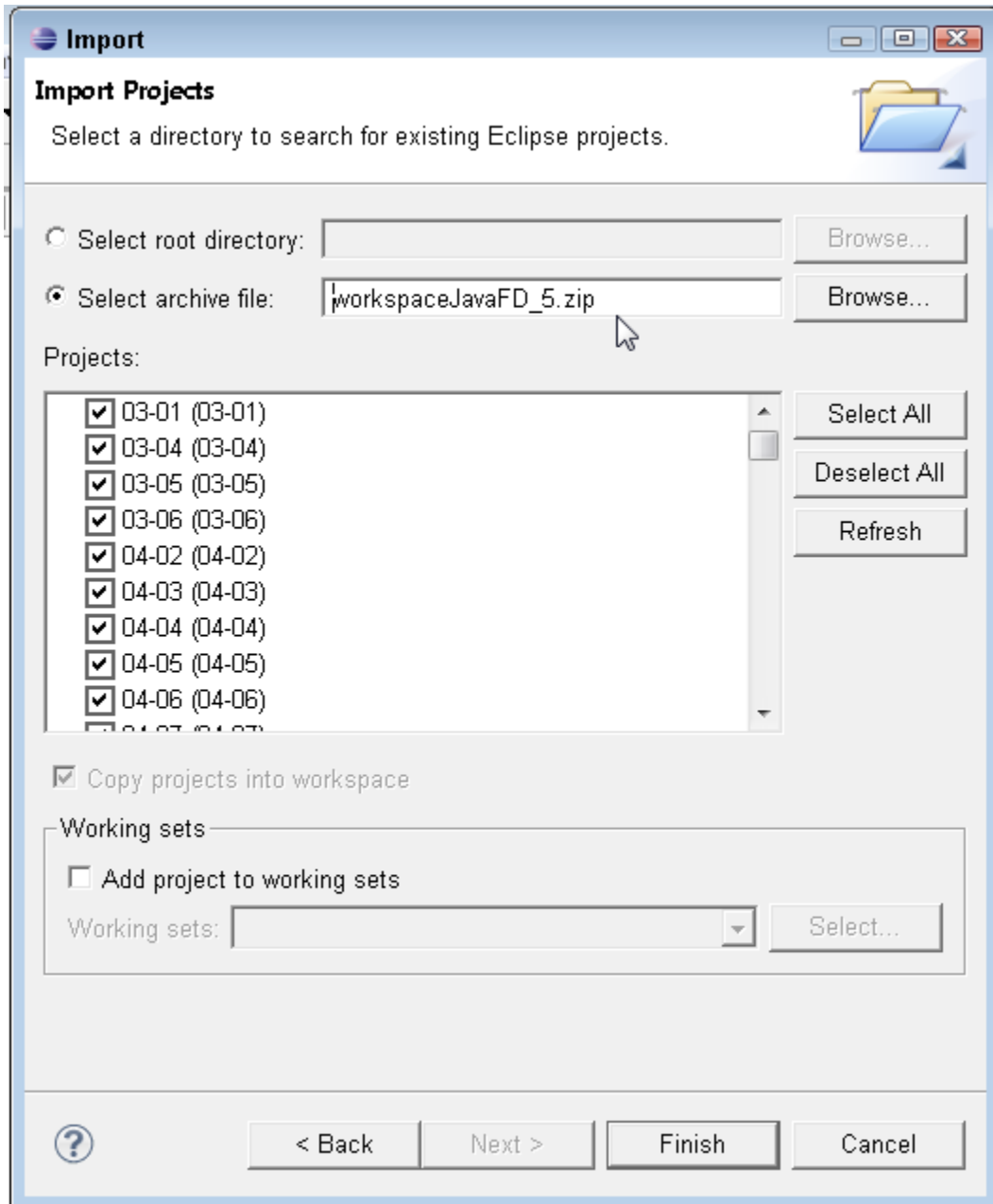


***Select archive file, then Browse to the location of the book's downloaded examples (a .zip file).***

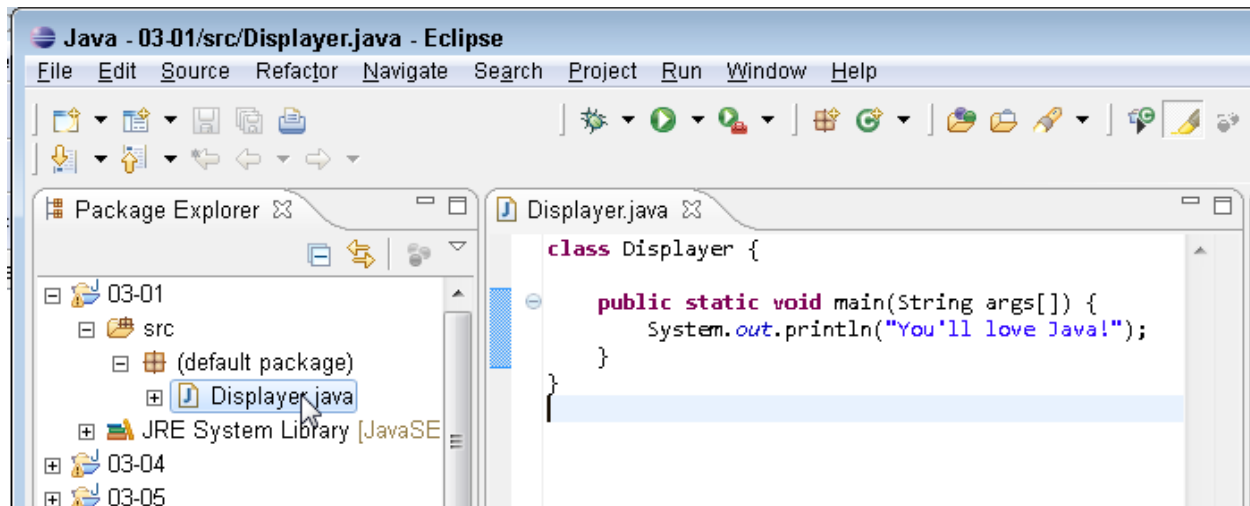

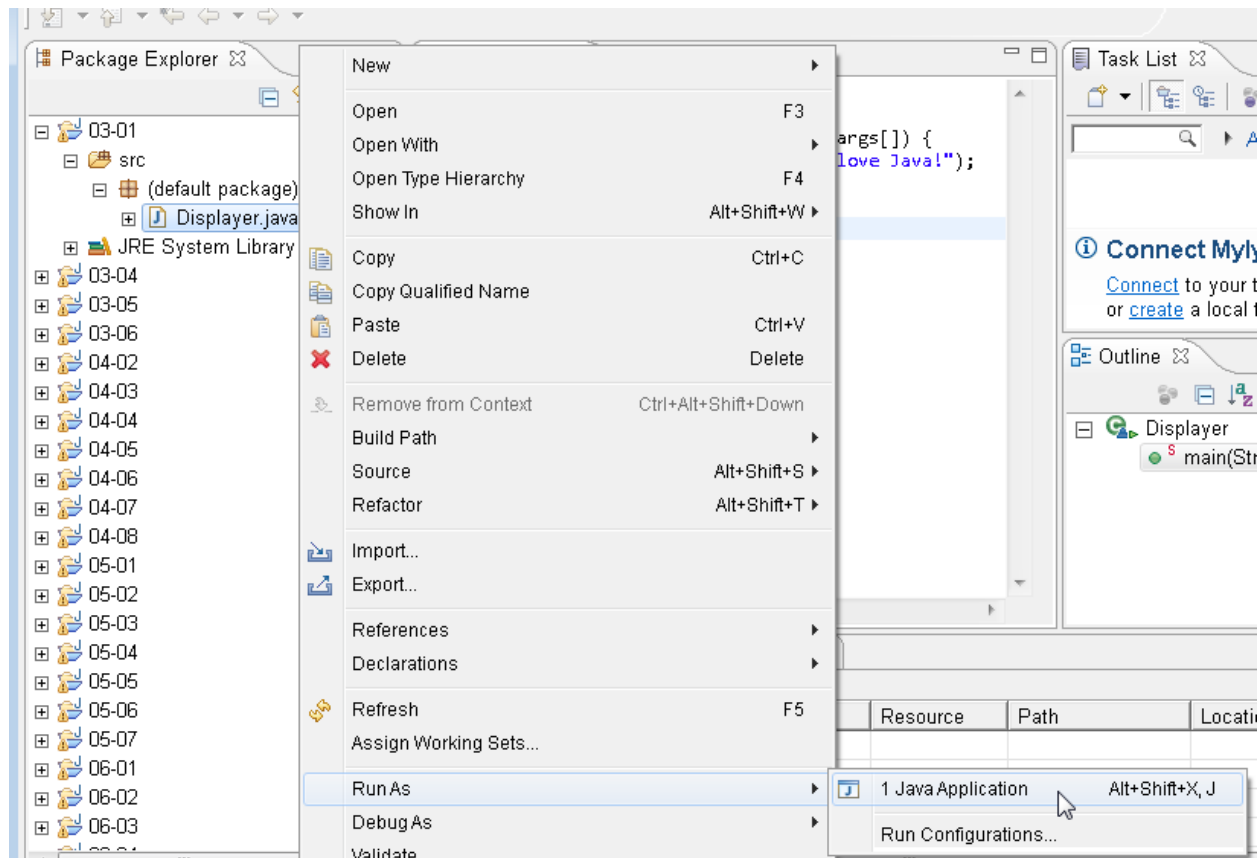
Working sets:
