

## Running a Program with Command-Line Arguments in NetBeans

Right-click (on Windows) or Control-Click (on a Mac) the project branch in the NetBeans Projects pane. In the resulting context menu, select Properties.



As a result, the Project Properties dialog box opens. On the left side of the Project Properties dialog box, select Run.




In the main body of the Project Properties dialog box, make sure that the Main Class field contains the name of the class containing the main method. Then type the command line arguments in the Arguments field. (For Listing 11-7 in *Java For Dummies*, 5th Edition, type the name of a file followed by a number. (In the figure, it's filename.txt 5).

Click OK to dismiss the Project Properties dialog box.

Run the program in the usual way (for example, by clicking the green arrow Run Project icon in the NetBeans toolbar).

After running the program from Listing 11-7, you can see the results by...

... selecting the Files tab (which is next to the Projects tab)...



 $\dots$  double-clicking the  ${\tt filename}$  .  ${\tt txt}$  branch of the Files tree.
